The BPA was thrilled to take part in the Indigenous Consultation Atlantic conference that took place on October 23rd and 24th, 2018. Jenna MacDonald, the BPA's Director of Marketing and Business Development, along with Jessica Vienneau, the BPA's Marketing & Communications Coordinator, were given the opportunity to attend the two-day long event. At the conference, topics ranged from the newly proposed *Impact Assessment Act* to learning about the concept of Two-Eyed Seeing and how to train the mind using Traditional Knowledge.

Also present were the BPA's Chair of the Board, Danika Keeley, and an Aboriginal Relations Consultant to the BPA, Tom Mann. The BPA was able to take a special role in the conference as the protocol that was signed earlier this year between the surrounding Mi'gmaq communities and the port was highlighted in a consultation model case study presentation called *Good Agreements Makes Good Neighbours at the Belledune Port Authority*. Mr. Mann and Chief David Peter-Paul of the Pabineau First Nations community delivered the presentation to the approximate one hundred people in attendance.
